## BEFORE THE WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR OF OREGON

## DOUGLAS COUNTY

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ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 4311

On October 18, 1979, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Carol H. Logan for approval of a change in point of diversion from North Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The affected water right is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 47058, Volume 40, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of G. H. Harrell, and is for the use of not to exceed 0.012 cubic foot per second from North Umpqua River, under a priority date of May 13, 1963, for irrigation of a certain 0.96 acre in NW4 NE4 of Section 23, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The authorized point of diversion is located 2550 feet South and 2620 feet West from the East Quarter Corner of Section 14, being within the SW<sup>1</sup><sub>4</sub> SE<sup>1</sup><sub>4</sub> of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion therefrom to a point located 775 feet South and 630 feet East from the North Quarter Corner of Section 23, being within the  $NW_4^1$   $NE_4^1$  of Section 23, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in The News-Review, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Douglas County, Oregon, for a period of three consecutive weeks in the issues of November 6, 13 and 20, 1979.

Mr. M. John Youngquist, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1981.

The order of the Water Resources Director entered March 14, 1979, approving transfer No. 4168, provided for cancellation of the certificate recorded at page 47058, Volume 40, State Record of Water Right Certificates, and issuance of a new certificate covering the balance of the right NOT involved in the transfer proceedings; therefore,

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the portion of the right involved in the change authorized herein NOT be included in the new certificate to be issued as porvided by the order entered March 14, 1979, approving transfer No. 4168; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
