Findings of Fact

- 1. On June 30, 2009, the KBRT and Kurt Thomas filed an application to renew instream lease L-574, involving all of Certificates 42935, 42934, 42936, and 65386 for instream use. The Department assigned the application number IL-574.
- 2. The lease application requested to protect water instream for five years, terminating on October 31, 2013. A Final Order approving the lease was issued by the Department on July 30, 2009, as evidenced by Special Order Volume 78, Page 568.
- 3. The final order contained a condition allowing the Lessor to terminate the lease in any year of the lease with notice submitted to the Department at least 30 days prior to the beginning of the instream period.
- 3. On February 28, 2011, the Department received a request from Lessor #1 to terminate the lease effective prior to water being protected instream in 2011.
- 4. The lease was exercised during the 2009 and 2010 water use periods ending on October 31, 2010.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Department concludes that terminating the lease in advance of the 2011 irrigation season is consistent with OAR 690-077.

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.
