IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF WINSTON-DILLARD WATER DISTRICT FOR THE APPROVAL OF A CHANGE IN USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER FROM SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 2814

On May 14, 1973, Winston-Dillard Water District filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in use and point of diversion of water from South Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to Marion G. Krebs and recorded at page 22109, Volume 16, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right to the use of not to exceed 0.8 cubic foot per second of water from South Umpqua River for the irrigation of, among other lands, 1.5 acres in SW¹₄ SE¹₄, Section 17, 16.3 acres in NE¹₄ NE¹₄, Section 19, 34.8 acres in NW¹₄ NW¹₄, 28.7 acres in NE¹₄ NW¹₄, 20.0 acres in NW¹₄ NE¹₄, 2.5 acres in SE¹₄ NW¹₄, and 2.0 acres in SW¹₄ NE¹₄, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of March 16, 1955. These lands are irrigated from a point of diversion located South 81° 29' East, 631.32 feet from the Southeast corner of John Cox DIC #49, being within the NE¹₄ SE¹₄ of Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the use from the irrigation of the above described lams to municipal use within the Winston-Dillard Water District within Sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 27, 28, 29, 32, 33, and 35, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M., and Sections 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, 10 and 17, Township 29 South, Range 6 West, W.M., and to change the point of diversion to a point to be located 1040 feet North and 1360 feet East from the Southwest corner of Section 21, being within the SE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ of Section 21, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

Notice of the filing of the application was given by publication setting forth a time and place certain for hearing objections to the proposed change in use and point of diversion of water, if any there were, namely: at the county courthouse in Roseburg, Oregon on October 2, 1973 at 9:30 a.m. The notice was published in the News Review, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Douglas County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of August 7, 14 and 21, 1973. The date set for hearing in said notice was not less than thirty days after the last publication of the notice.

Mr. M. John Youngquist, Watermaster of District No. 15, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in use and point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in place of use of water is approved and the water right hereinbefore described as being for the irrigation of 1.5 acres in SW2 SE2, Section 17, 16.3 acres in NE2 NE2, Section 19, 34.8 acres in NW2 NW2, 28.7 acres in NE2 NW2, 20.0 acres in NW2 NE2, 2.5 acres in SE2 NW2, and 2.0 acres in SW2 NE2, Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M., with a date of priority of March 16, 1955, be severed therefrom and simultaneously and without loss of priority transferred to municipal purposes for the Winston-Dillard Water District within:

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from South Umpqua River, to wit:

From a point located S. 81° 29' East from the Southeast corner of John Cox DLC #49, being within the NET SET of Section 20, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

To a point to be located 1040 feet North and 1360 feet East from the Southwest corner of Section 21, being within the SE_4^4 SW $_4^4$ of Section 21, Township 28 South, Range 6 West, W.M.

for municipal purposes within the Winston-Dillard Water District in the area described above, with a date of priority of March 16, 1955, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1976.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.66 cubic foot per second, and further limited to the appropriation of water during the irrigation season only.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be carried out prior to the diverting of water at the new point of diversion as herein confirmed.

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that certificate of water right heretofore issued to Marion G. Krebs and recorded at page 22109, Volume 16, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the lands not involved in this proceeding and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the State Engineer of completion of the authorized change in use and point of diversion, a certificate of water right shall be issued to Winston-Dillard Water District confirming the extent to which the water has been applied beneficially.
