ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3022

On April 24, 1974, Mildred I. Rhoten and Harry E. Wardle filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Evans Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 340.510 to 540.530.

By Decree of the Circuit Court for Jackson County, Oregon, entered May 19, 1964, In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Rogue River and its Tributaries, a water right was established in the name of George Beers for the use of the waters of Evans Creek for the irrigation of, among other lands, 16.5 acres in SW\(^1_4\) NE\(^1_4\), Section 11, with a date of priority of February 20, 1896 and 7.0 acres in SE\(^1_2\) NE\(^1_4\), Section 11, with a date of priority of 1896, all in Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M., as evidenced by certificate of water right recorded at page 32767, Volume 24, State Record of Water Right Certificates. These lands are irrigated by means of the Williams and Whalen ditch from a point of diversion located 475 feet North and 860 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 6, being within the SE\(^1_4\) Section 6, Township 35 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to irrigate these lands from a point of diversion to be located 1870 feet South and 820 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 11, being within the $SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ NE $_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, Section 11, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Notice of the filing of the application was given by publication setting forth a time and place certain for hearing objections to the proposed change in point of diversion of water, if any there were, namely: at the county courthouse ir Medford, Oregon on August 6, 1974, at 9:30 a.m. The notice was published in the Medford Mail Tribune, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of June 11, 18 and 25, 1974. The date set for hearing in said notice was not less than thirty days after the last publication of the notice.

Mr. David C. Hendrix, Watermaster of District No. 13, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from Evans Creek, to wit:

From a point located 475 feet North and 860 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 6, being within the $SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Section 6, Township 35 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

To a point to be located 1870 feet South and 820 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section II, being within the SE4 NE4 of Section 11, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

for the irrigation of 16.5 acres in SW4 NE4, Section 11, with a date of priority of February 20, 1896 and 7.0 acres in SE4 NE4, Section 13, with a date of priority of 1896, all in Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M., is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1975.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old

point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.28 cubic foot per second under a priority of February 20, 1896, and 0.12 cubic foot per second under a pri-rity of 1896.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices.

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that certificate of water right heretofore issued to George Beers and recorded at page 32767, Volume 24, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the lands not involved in this proceeding, and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the State Engineer of completion of the authorized change in point of diversion, a certificate of water right shall be issued to Mildred I. Rhoten and Harry E. Wardle confirming the change in point of diversion.
