 USE HERETOFORE MADE OF WATER)

On December 15, 1986, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Stayton Industrial Properties for approval of a change in use heretofore made of water from North Santiam River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 53757, Volume 49, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Stayton Industrial Properties for Santiam Water Control District, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 0.82 cubic foot per second from North Santiam River, for irrigation of a certain:

23.2 acres NE 1/4 SW 1/4
 12.3 acres NW 1/4 SW 1/4
 7.8 acres SW 1/4 SW 1/4
 22.6 acres SE 1/4 SW 1/4
 Section 9
 Township 9 South, Range 1 West, WM,

with a date of priority of June 24, 1911.

Water for the said right is diverted, through the Salem Ditch, from a point located 1800 feet South and 2830 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 11, being within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 (Lot 2) of Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 1 West, WM.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the use heretofore made therefrom, to municipal use for the City of Stayton, within:

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in The Stayton Mail, a newspaper having general circulation in the area in which the water right is located, for a period of three weeks in the issues of January 7, 14 and 21, 1987.

Clif R. King, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in use heretofore made may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in use heretofore made may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in use heretofore made is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water used for the proposed purpose shall not exceed 0.82 cubic foot per second, and shall be used only during the irrigation season of each year.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;


That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the subject water right is hereby severed from the use and place of use described in Certificate 53757, and shall be beneficially used as authorized by this order on or before October 1, 1992.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the right to divert water from the point described in Certificate 53757 is hereby canceled, and water shall be used from the new diversion point on or before October 1, 1992.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 53757, Volume 49, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the City of Stayton.
