## **Findings of Fact**

- 1. On May 3, 2013, DICKMAN FARMS INC. filed an application to temporarily change the place of use under Certificate 84269 for a period of five years. The Department assigned the application number T-11590.
- 2. On June 13, 2013, the Water Resources Department issued an order approving T-11590. The order was recorded at Special Order Volume 89, Page 957.
- 3. The order approving Temporary Transfer T-11590 authorized reversion of the temporary place of use back to the authorized place of use at the end of the 2017 irrigation season.
- 4. On January 9, 2014, Mark Dickman, of Dickman Farms, Inc., submitted a letter requesting to revert the temporary place of use of T-11590 back to the authorized place of use at the end of the 2014 irrigation season.

## Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The use described in the order approving Temporary Transfer T-11590 shall revert to the authorized place of use at the end of the 2014 irrigation season.
- 2. Temporary Transfer Application T-11560, in the name of Dickman Farms, shall be Terminated at the end of the 2014 irrigation season and will be of no further force or effect after that date. The water right should immediately revert back to the original place of use.
