THIS ORDER ISSUED TO

CENTRAL OREGON IRRIGATION DISTRICT for BEND METROPOLITAN PARK & RECREATION DISTRICT 1055 SW LAKE COURT REDMOND OR 97756

confirms the right to use the waters of the DESCHUTES RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 6.31 ACRES.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County as evidenced by a portion of an order of the Water Resources director, entered at Special Order Volume 74, Page 270, approving Transfer 10466. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 12, at Page 282 and Volume 16, at Pages 1 and 390. The dates of priority are October 31, 1900 and December 2, 1907.

The maximum rates of diversion from the Deschutes River under the portion of the right evidenced by Certificate 83571 for delivery to the water user's property shall continue to be based on 6.31 acres of irrigation right transferred, excluding a 45% transmission loss, being:

0.04 cfs from April 1 through April 30 and October 1 through October 31;
0.06 cfs from May 1 through May 14 and September 16 to September 30;
0.11 cfs from May 15 through September 15; being 0.077 cfs under the 1900 priority date and 0.033 cfs under the 1907 priority date

The authorized point of diversion is located as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The quantity of water diverted at the additional/new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available from the original point of diversion described as follows:

The water user shall maintain a fish screen and/or fish by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's operational and maintenance standards.

The water user shall maintain and operate the existing measurement device and shall make such improvements as may be required by the Department.

The water user shall maintain the existing headgate and shall make such improvements as may be required by the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 83571 and any related decree.

This order is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF DIVERSION AND PLACE OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered FEBRUARY 26, 2008, at Special Order Volume 74, Page 270, approving Transfer Application 10466, affecting a portion of Certificate 83571, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The Department will issue a superseding certificate describing the right when it determines that it is necessary for record keeping.
