Authority

ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of appropriation, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department’s procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

Background

1. On October 4, 2010, JERRY AND DONNA BALDOCK filed an application to change the point of appropriation and to change the place of use under Certificate 82932. The Department assigned the application number T-11139.
2. With the transfer application, the applicants submitted a Consent by Deeded Landowner form signed by the owner of the property to which the water right is appurtenant.
3. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 82932 in the name of CATHLEEN WARNER (perfected under Permit G-12549)

Use: IRRIGATION of 2.0 ACRES

Priority Date: AUGUST 11, 1993

Rate: 0.025 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

4. Transfer Application T-11139 proposes to move the authorized point of appropriation approximately 4 miles north from the existing point of appropriation to:

5. Transfer Application T-11139 also proposes to change the place of use of the right to:

6. Notice of the application for transfer was published on October 12, 2010, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
7. On January 7, 2011, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-11139 and mailed a copy to the applicants. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of February 7, 2011, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.
8. On January 12, 2011, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-11139 and mailed a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on January 18, 2011, and in The Nugget newspaper on January 26, and February 2 and 9, 2011, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-390-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notices.

Transfer Review Criteria (OAR 690-380-4010)

9. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
10. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-11139.
11. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
12. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.

Conclusions of Law


The change in point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-11139 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The change in point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed in application T-11139 are approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 82932 and any related decree.
3. Water right certificate 82932 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.
5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of appropriation.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

6. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.
7. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
8. The approved changes shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2012**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
9. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
