ORDER APPROVING AN EMERGENCY USE DROUGHT
TEMPORARY CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE

Pursuant to ORS 536.750 and OAR 690-19-0055, after finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TEMPORARY DROUGHT TRANSFER 9202 submitted by

ROI JEAN LAURANCE
8559 TILLER TRAIL
CANYONVILLE, OREGON 97417.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by Special Order Volume 34, Page 160, entered December 29, 1980, approving Transfer Application 4580, was perfected under Permit 4615 with a date of priority of MAY 25, 1920. Proof to the satisfaction of the Director that use of water has been accomplished under the terms and conditions of Transfer Application 4580 has been received. The right allows the use of the SOUTH UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of the UMPQUA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 20.0 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.25 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: SE¼ SE¼, AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 39, SECTION 7, T 30 S, R 4 W, W.M.; 850 FEET NORTH AND 20 FEET WEST FROM

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2).

Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-01-005, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order.

SE CORNER, SECTION 7, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized place of use is as follows:

NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ 20.0 ACRES (TAX LOT 100)
SECTION 18
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The applicant proposes to **TEMPORARILY** change the place of use to:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ 20.0 ACRES (TAX LOT 900)
SECTION 8
TOWNSHIP 30 SOUTH, RANGE 4 WEST, W.M.


THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. This change is **temporary**. This change shall be effective upon issuance of this order.
2. The use shall revert to the authorized place of use at the end of the 2002 irrigation season or the end of the Governor's declared drought, whichever occurs first.

3. Water used under Permit 4615 at the original location together with water used at the proposed location shall not exceed 0.25 cubic foot per second or 60.0 acre-feet during the 2002 irrigation season.
7. The approval of this temporary transfer may be revoked if injury to existing water rights is shown and cannot be mitigated to the satisfaction of the Director and injured parties.
8. Issuance of this temporary drought transfer order may not protect the person receiving the transfer from liability for improper use of the water under the transfer.
9. When required by the Department the water user shall install an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water used. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
