**Findings of Fact**

1. The Department received an affidavit from Azalea Rojo, c/o AgIS Capital, the owner of lands and the water right appurtenant as evidenced by water right Certificate 11530.
2. Water right Certificate 11530 allows the use of 0.07 cubic foot per second (cfs), from Lookingglass Creek, a tributary of the South Umpqua River, for irrigation of 5.25 acres. The priority date is November 13, 1931.
3. The affiant requests the entirety of the water right Certificate 11530 be diminished from a right for primary irrigation to a right for supplemental irrigation.
4. The affidavit requests irrigation of the following lands be diminished from irrigation to supplemental irrigation:

**Now, therefore, it is ORDERED**

1. Certificate 11530 is cancelled.
2. The water right for irrigation of 5.25 acres as described by Certificate 11530 is diminished from a right for primary irrigation to a right for supplemental irrigation.
3. The Department shall issue a new, superseding water right certificate to describe the diminution of the right to supplemental irrigation.
