1. On May 13, 2016, the Department issued a Final Order and Superseding Permit G-17602 for an additional point of appropriation proposed under Permit Amendment T-12274 and approved by Special Order Volume 100, Page 535.
2. The Superseding Permit contained a scrivener's error describing the name of the Permit Holder as follows:


C AND J PROPERTIES

2. All other terms and conditions of Special Order Volume 100, Page 881 remain the same.
