## Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

## **Findings of Fact**

## Background

- On May 6, 2008, Bernard and Jean Damon filed an application for an additional point of diversion under Certificates 113, 52223 and 52224. The Department assigned the application number T-10617.
- 2. On June 1, 2009, the applicant submitted an amended map to clarify the place of use under the existing water rights.
- 3. The first right to be transferred is as follows:

7. Transfer Application T-10617 proposes an additional point of diversion for all the above described rights located:

- 8. Notice of the application for transfer was published on May 20, 2008, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- 9. On November 28, 2008, the Department mailed a letter to the applicant identifying multiple deficiencies in the application and map. The agent for the applicant requested that the Department grant additional time in which to amend the application and correct the map. A new amended application was received February 18, 2009, and a new map was received on June 1, 2009.
- 10. On June 5, 2009, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10617 to the applicants. The cover letter for the draft Preliminary Determination set forth a deadline of July 6, 2009, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 11. On June 26, 2009, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10617 and mailed a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on June 30, 2009, and in the Heppner-Gazette Times newspaper on July 8, 15, and 22, 2009, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.
- 12. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

## Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 13. Water has been used within the five-year period prior to submittal of the transfer application according to the terms and conditions of the rights. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the rights are subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 14. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-10617.
- 15. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the rights.
- 16. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.

#### **Conclusions of Law**

The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-10617 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

## Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-10617 is approved.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 113, 52223, and 52224 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right certificates 113, 52223, and 52224 are cancelled.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 5. The Director may require the water user to install a totalizing a flow meter or other suitable measuring devices at each point of diversion. If the Director notifies the water user to install totalizing flow meters or other measuring devices, the water user shall install such devices specified by the Director within the period allowed in the notice. Once installed, the water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order and shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices.
- 6. When required by the Department, the water user shall install, maintain and operate a headgate to control and regulate the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 7. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.
- 8. The approved change shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2010**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.

<ol><li>When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.</li></ol>
