 ) OF APPROPRIATION

ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of appropriation, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

**Findings of Fact**

1. Weyerhaeuser Co. filed an application to change the place of use and character of use and to add points of appropriation under Certificate 50294. The Department assigned the application number T-8043.
2. On February 27, 2006, a request was received from the applicant to drop the proposed change in place of use and character of use from the transfer application.
3. The right to be transferred is as follows:

**Certificate:** 50294 in the name of Bohemia Inc. (perfected under Permit G-6645)

**Use:** Boiler makeup

**Priority Date:** January 27, 1976

**Rate:** 0.22 cubic foot per second

**Source:** A well in the Dry Muddy Creek Basin

**Authorized Point of Appropriation:**

**NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW**

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

5. The notification of a Specific-to-General Industrial Water Use Change under Certificate 50294 that was submitted by the applicant on February 27, 2006, is consistent with the requirements of OAR 690-380-2340.
6. Notice of the application for transfer was published pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4000. One comment was filed in response to the notice.
7. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right, and no evidence is available that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
8. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right is present.
9. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
10. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.
11. Public notice of the preliminary determination was published in the Department's Weekly Notice on March 21, 2006. No protests were received in response to the notice.


**Conclusion of Law:**

The additional points of appropriation proposed in application T-8043 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705, 540.505 to 540.580, and OAR 690-380-5000.

**Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:**

1. The additional points of appropriation proposed in application T-8043 are approved.
2. Water Right Certificate 50294 is cancelled.
3. The right to use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 50294 and any related decree.
4. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.
5. The approved changes shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2007**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
6. For purposes of making proof on the approved changes, the water user may exercise the right consistent with the specific to general industrial use notification.
7. The quantity of water diverted at the additional points of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.
8. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water appropriated. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
9. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued. The certificate shall describe the authorized place of use and character of use of the right of record and shall authorize the exercise of the right consistent with general industrial use as shown in the notification and claim of beneficial use.
