**Authority**

Pursuant to OAR 137-004-0080(5), within 60 calendar days after the date of the order, the agency may, on its own initiative, reconsider the final order. If a petition for judicial review has been filed, the agency must follow the procedures set forth in ORS 183.484(4) before taking further action on the order. The procedural and substantive effect of granting reconsideration under this subsection shall be identical to the effect of granting a party's petition for reconsideration.

**Findings of Fact**

1. On April 1, 2022, the Department issued a final order approving Water Right Application G-18998 and Permit G-18775.
2. Upon further review, the Department determined that Permit G-18775 was erroneously issued due to the full 580.5 acre-foot mitigation obligation not being provided.

**Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:**

1. The Final Order for Application G-18998 and Permit G-18775 are rescinded.
