) AND CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE

Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

Background

1. On May 6, 2009, Anthony Pagliarulo, Paul Pagliarulo, and Joyce Pagliarulo filed an application to change the point of diversion and change the place of use under Certificate 84366. The Department assigned the application number T-10870.
2. On October 1, 2009, the application was modified to include a change in point of diversion for an additional 2.25 acres under Certificate 84366.
3. The right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 84366 in the name of ANTHONY P. PAGLIARULO (confirmed by Grande Ronde River Decree)
Use: IRRIGATION of 17.5 ACRES
Priority Date: 1866
Limit/Duty: The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually used beneficially, and shall not exceed 3.0 ACRE FEET PER

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

ACRE in any irrigation season at a rate of not to exceed ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre.

4. Certificate 84366 does not describe the location of the point of diversion, however information is available from the application map indicating that the point of diversion is located as follows:

5. Transfer Application T-10870 proposes to change the point of diversion location approximately 0.35 mile downstream to:

6. Application T-10870 also proposes to change the place of use of 15.25 acres listed in Finding of Fact #3 to:

7. Notice of the application for transfer was published on May 26, 2009, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
8. On March 15, 2010, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10870 to the applicants. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of April 20, 2010, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.

9. On July 9, 2010, the applicants verified their intent to change the point of diversion for the entire right and acceptance of the Watermaster's and ODFW's conditions outlined in the draft Preliminary Determination.
10. On July 14, 2010, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-10870, and mailed a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice of July 20, 2010, and in The Observer newspaper on July 23 and 30, 2010, and August 6, 2010, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notices.
11. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has determined that a fish screening and/or by-pass device is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and/or safely transport fish back to the body of water from which the fish were diverted and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screening and/or by-pass device. This diversion may be eligible for screening cost share funds.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

12. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
13. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right was present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-10870.
14. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the right.
15. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.

Conclusions of Law


The change in point of diversion and change in place of use proposed in Transfer Application T-10870 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The change in point of diversion and change in place of use proposed in application T-10870 are approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 84366 and any related decree.
3. Water right certificate 84366 is cancelled.

4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.
5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at the point of diversion.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the measuring device in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the measuring device; provided however, where the measuring device is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
6. Prior to diverting water, the water user shall install a fish screening and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the new point of diversion consistent with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) design and construction standards. Prior to installation, the water user shall obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screen and/or by-pass device meets ODFW's criteria. Prior to submitting a Claim of Beneficial Use, the water user must obtain written approval from ODFW that the required screening and/or by-pass device was installed to the state's criteria. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen and/or by-pass device, as appropriate, at the point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards.
7. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
8. The approved changes shall be completed and full beneficial use of the water shall be made on or before **October 1, 2011**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the changes and full beneficial use of the water.
9. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
