

5. The right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 81166 in the name of CARL F. JENSEN (perfected under Permit G-9898)
Use: IRRIGATION OF 36.6 ACRES
Priority Dates: SEPTEMBER 7, 1978, FOR 0.28 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), AND OCTOBER 8, 1982, FOR 0.18 CFS
Rate: 0.46 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND
Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

6. Transfer Application T-12293 proposes an additional point of appropriation approximately 1200 feet from the existing point of appropriation to:

Transfer Review Criteria (OAR 690-380-4010)

7. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
8. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-12293.
9. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
10. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.
11. All other application requirements are met.

Determination and Proposed Action

The additional point of appropriation proposed in Transfer Application T-12293 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The additional point of appropriation proposed in Transfer Application T-12293 is approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 81166 and any related decree.
3. Water Right Certificate 81166 is cancelled.
4. The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of appropriation, together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.
5. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.
6. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2018**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
7. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
