ORDER APPROVING TEMPORARY CHANGES IN PLACE OF USE

Pursuant to ORS 540.523, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TEMPORARY TRANSFER 8090 submitted by

GOSCHIE FARMS, INC.
7365 MERIDIAN ROAD NE
SILVERTON, OREGON 97381.

The first right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of the Special Order of the Water Resources Director entered July 2, 1998, at Special Order Volume 52, Page 614, approving TRANSFER 6895, was perfected under Permit 15894 with a date of priority of AUGUST 8, 1944. The right allows the use of ABIQUA CREEK, a tributary of the PUDDING RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 20.0 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.25 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 19, T 6 S, R 1 E, WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The second right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of the Special Order of the Water Resources Director entered July 2, 1998, at Special Order Volume 52, Page 614, approving TRANSFER 6895, was perfected under Permit 16003 with a date of priority of OCTOBER 12, 1944. The right allows the use of ABIQUA CREEK, a tributary of the PUDDING RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 4.7 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion: SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 19, T 6 S, R 1 E, WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The third right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of the Special Order of the Water Resources Director entered July 2, 1998, at Special Order Volume 52, Page 614, approving TRANSFER 6895, was perfected under Permit 24772 with a date of priority of MARCH 15, 1957. The right allows the use of ABIQUA CREEK, a tributary of the PUDDING RIVER, for IRRIGATION of 7.9 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.10 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: SW¼ SW¼, SECTION 19, T 6 S, R 1 E WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The authorized points of diversion are located as follows:

SW¼ SW¼, SECTION 19, T 6 S, R 1 E, WM; 4790 FEET SOUTH AND 720 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 19;

SE¼ SW¼, SECTION 19, T 6 S, R 1 E, WM; 5090 FEET SOUTH AND 1580 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER, SECTION 19.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under an other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2½ acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized places of use are located as follows:

SE¼ SW¼	12.0 ACRES

PERMIT 16033

NE¼ SW¼ 4.7 ACRES

PERMIT 24772

SW¼ SW¼ 7.9 ACRES

SECTION 19

TOWNSHIP 6 SOUTH, RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.

The water user shall maintain a head gate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the head gate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The water user shall maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described

The applicant proposes to TEMPORARILY change the places of use to:

NW¼ NW¼ 0.6 ACRE
