- 1. On August 28, 2010 the US Bureau of Reclamation application to lease portions of Water Right Certificates 84863, 84866, 84867, 84862 and 85585 for instream use. The Department assigned the application number IL-1093.
- 2. On September 13, 2010 Matt Howard, acting on behalf of the US Bureau of Reclamation, requested that instream lease application IL-1093 be withdrawn.
- 3. The fee submitted with the instream lease application was exhausted during the Departments' initial review process.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

Instream lease application IL-1093, in the name of the US Bureau of Reclamation, is withdrawn and of no further force or effect. There will be no refund.
