Order of Proper Proof of a Change in
Character of Use Under Transfer 9527

confirms the right to use the waters of the DESCHUTES RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for MINING. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.20 cubic foot per second (CFS) for SEASON 1, 0.27 CFS for SEASON 2, and 0.49 CFS for SEASON 3, being 0.35 CFS for October 31, 1900 and 0.14 CFS for December 2, 1907, if available at the authorized point of diversion.

This right was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Deschutes County. The decree is of record at Salem, in the Order of Record of the Water Resources Director, in Volume 12, at page 282, and in Volume 16, at pages 1 and 390. The dates of priority are October 31, 1900 and December 2, 1907.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of not to exceed the quantity determined by decree of the Circuit Court for Deschutes County, Dated March 24, 1933, being:

SEASON 1 - APRIL 1 TO MAY 1 AND OCT. 1 TO NOV. 1	1.0 CFS TO 80.0 ACRES
SEASON 2 - MAY 1 TO MAY 15 AND SEPT. 15 TO OCT. 1	1.0 CFS TO 60.0 ACRES
SEASON 3 - MAY 15 TO SEPT. 15	1.0 CFS TO 32.4. ACRES

For each acre irrigated by the Central Oregon Irrigation District main canal system during the irrigation season of each year, not to exceed 9.91 acre-feet for each acre irrigated (158.56 AF) during the irrigation season as measured at the diversion from the source. The quantities reflect a 45% transmission loss as determined by decree of the Circuit Court for Deschutes County, dated March 24, 1933. Those lands not served from the district main canal systems but by direct pumping from the Deschutes River will not be allowed the 45% transmission loss.

The authorized point of diversion is located as follows:

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482. Pursuant to ORS 183.482, ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review and petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

The right to the use of the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on lands or place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 76358 and any related decree.

This order is issued to confirm a change in CHARACTER OF USE approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered May 10, 2006, at Special Order Volume 68, Page 418, approving Transfer Application 9527, affecting a portion of Certificate 76358, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The Department will issue a superseding certificate describing the right when it determines that it is necessary for record keeping.
