9. Transfer Application T-11811 proposes to change the points of appropriation approximately 0.9 mile from authorized well 1 and 0.8 mile and 0.6 mile from authorized well 2 to:

Transfer Review Criteria (OAR 690-380-4010)

10. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the rights.

11. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing rights were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-11811.
12. The proposed changes would not result in enlargement of the rights.
13. The proposed changes would not result in injury to other water rights.
14. All other application requirements are met.

Conclusions of Law:


The changes in points of appropriation proposed in Transfer Application T-11811 are consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The changes in points of appropriation proposed in Transfer Application T-11811 are approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificates 54875 and 85895 and any related decree.
3. Water Right Certificates 54875 and 85895 are cancelled. New certificates will be issued describing those portions of the rights not affected by this transfer.
4. The quantity of water diverted at the new points of appropriation shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of appropriation.
5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device at each new point of appropriation.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
6. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original points of appropriation.
7. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2016**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.

8. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, new certificates confirming the rights transferred will be issued.
