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ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 4177

On March 23, 1979, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Lee Gillins for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from Little Luckiamute River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 31514, Volume 23, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Jesse Payne, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 0.24 cubic foot per second from Little Luckiamute River for irrigation of a certain 4.4 acres in SW_4^1 SE_4^1 , 0.1 acre in SE_4^1 SE_4^1 of Section 9; 9.0 acres in NE_4^1 NE_4^1 and 5.6 acres in NW_4^1 NE_4^1 of Section 16, Township 9 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of November 18, 1960.

The authorized point of diversion of record for said right is 1ocated 350 feet South and 80 feet West from the Northeast Corner of D.L.C. No. 57, being within the SE_4^1 SE_4^1 of Section 9, Township 9 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the place of use and point of diversion, without loss of priority, by severing the right from the 4.4 acres in SW14 SE14 and 0.1 acre in SE14 SE14 of Section 9 above described and in lieu thereof irrigate a certain other 2.5 acres in SE14 SW14, 0.8 acre in SW14 SE14 of Section 9, and 1.2 acres in NE14 NW14 of Section 16, Township 9 South, Range 5 West, W.M., and to irrigate these lands, together with the remaining 9.0 acres in NE14 NE14 and 5.6 acres in NW14 NE14 of said Section 16 from a point of diversion located 150 feet South and 230 feet West from the Northeast Corner of D.L.C. No. 57, being within the SE14 SE14 of Section 9, Township 9 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

Mr. Michael F. Ladd, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights,

the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.24 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion made and that said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1980.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right recorded at page 31514, Volume 23, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
