ORS 537.455 to 537.500 as amended by 2003 HB 2456, authorize and establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request for an allocation of conserved water. OAR Chapter 690, Division 018 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating allocation of conserved water applications.

## **Findings of Fact**

- 1. On March 20, 2006, Central Oregon Irrigation District filed an allocation of conserved water application. The Department assigned the application number CW-42.
- 2. On October 2, 2006, the Department issued Special Order Volume 70, Page 261 approving the allocation and assignment of conserved water.
- Special Order Volume 70, Page 261 temporarily reserved instream the District's portion of the allocation of conserved water until a permanent place of use was determined. The priority date, rate, and duty reserved instream were:

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW OR RECONSIDERATION

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

The water was protected in the Deschutes River from the authorized point of diversion for Certificate 76358 at approximately RM 165 at:

4. On March 19, 2007, the Department received a request from Central Oregon Irrigation District to finalize the place of use associated with the District's share of the conserved water. The District requested that the water be permanently placed instream.

## Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The Department shall issue a new instream certificate for conservation, maintenance and enhancement of aquatic and fish life, wildlife, fish and wildlife habitat and other ecological values in the Deschutes River from the authorized point of diversion at approximately RM 165 for Certificate 76358 at:
