Authority

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of appropriation, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implement the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

ORS 540.621 establishes the process for the owner of land to which a water right is appurtenant to certify under oath that the water right, or a portion thereof, has been abandoned and to voluntarily request that it be cancelled.

Findings of Fact

1. On September 8, 2017, RAINBOW WATER DISTRICT, ATTN: JAMIE PORTER, filed an application to change from a surface water point of diversion to groundwater points of appropriation and to change the place of use, and character of use under Certificate 57754. The Department assigned the application number T-12739.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

- 2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on September 12, 2017, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
- On December 1, 2017, the Department sent a deficiency letter to the applicant's agent addressing a few discrepancies found in the application.
- On December 4, 2017, the Department sent a revised deficiency letter to the applicant's agent requesting clarification on the distance from the proposed points of appropriation to the surface water source and the authorized points of appropriation.
- 5. On December 8, 2017, the Applicant's agent submitted a revised Table 1 and 2 of the application and a revised map clarifying the items addressed in the deficiency letters sent by the Department on December 1, 2017 and December 4, 2017.
- On January 11, 2018, the Applicant's agent submitted a revised Table 1 and 2 of the application and a revised map.
- On January 12, 2018, the Department mailed a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-12739 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of February 12, 2018, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicant is authorized to pursue the transfer.
- 8. On February 26, 2018, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer T-12739 and mailed a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on February 27, 2018, and in the Eugene Register Guard newspaper on April 28, 2018 and May 5, 2018, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.

10. The Applicant's Certified Water Right Examiner provided a different measured distance indicating that the authorized point of diversion under Certificate 57754 is more accurately described as being located as follows:

11. Transfer Application T-12739 proposes to change from a surface water point of diversion to hydraulically connected groundwater points of appropriation for the lands described in Finding of Fact #6, located as follows:

- 12. Certificate 57754 does not specify the irrigation season. However, the Willamette Basin Program established the irrigation season for the area as March 1 through October 31. Therefore, consistent with OAR 690-502, the irrigation season for this application is March 1 through October 31.
- 13. Transfer Application T-12739 proposes to change the character of use to municipal use. The use will be limited to the irrigation season of March 1 through October 31.

14. Transfer Application T-12739 proposes to change the place of use of the right to:

MUNICIPAL USE

WITHIN THE RAINBOW WATER DISTRICT
SERVICE AREA

15. The total volume of water that may be diverted annually for municipal uses is 53.25 acre-feet (2.5 x 21.3 = 53.25 acre-feet) during the irrigation season of March 1 through October 31.

Transfer Review Criteria (OAR 690-380-4010)

- 16. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
- 17. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-12739.
- 18. The proposed points of appropriation meet the requirements of ORS 540.531 and OAR 690-380-2130(2)(c) and (11)(b).
- 19. The proposed change, as conditioned, would not result in enlargement of the right.
- 20. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.
- 21. All other application requirements are met.

Partial Cancellation of a Water Right

- 22. On September 8, 2017, the applicant submitted an affidavit meeting the requirements of ORS 540.621 for the partial cancellation of Water Right Certificate 57754. The applicant has abandoned any and all interest in this portion of the water right.
- 23. The portion of the water right to be cancelled is as follows:

Use: IRRIGATION of 0.2 ACRE

under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to

ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation

season of each year.

Conclusions of Law

The changes from a surface water point of diversion to groundwater points of appropriation and to change the place of use and character of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12739 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000 and the abandoned right should be cancelled.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- The change from a surface water point of diversion to groundwater points of appropriation, and changes in place of use and character of use proposed in Transfer Application T-12739 are approved. The portion of the right that has been abandoned is cancelled.
- The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described. and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 57754 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right Certificate 57754 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer and cancellation.
- The quantity of water diverted at the new points of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion.
- The wells from which water is taken under the right shall be constructed so that the use of the wells will affect the surface water source similarly to the use of the original authorized point of diversion.
- The use of water under this right shall be subject to regulation consistent with other water rights from the surface water source and to all other applicable conditions and restrictions that existed at the original point of diversion.
- If, within five years after approval of the transfer, the Department finds that the transfer results in substantial or undue interference with an existing ground water right due to use of the well, that would not have occurred in the absence of the transfer, the new point of appropriation shall be subordinate to the existing right injured by the transfer.

- 8. The original point of diversion of surface water shall not be retained as an additional or supplemental point of diversion under the transferred portion of the right. However, if within five years after approval of the transfer, the Department receives a transfer application to return to the last authorized surface water point of diversion, the application shall be approved.
- 9. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer (water source) as the original point of appropriation.
- 10. The former place of use of the transferred right shall no longer receive water under the right.
- 11. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each new point of appropriation.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 12. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2027**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
- 13. The use of water under the proposed municipal use shall be limited to a rate of diversion of 0.27 cubic foot per second and further limited to a total quantity of water diverted of 53.25 acre-feet during the season of March 1 through October 31.
- 14. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
