Findings of Fact

- 1. The Department received the claim of beneficial use and final proof maps submitted by the applicant on September 7, 2007.
- 2. The claim of beneficial use does not contain maps of the points of diversion from the source. However, since the these changes are for place of use only, within an irrigation district, and do not involve changes in point of diversion, the existing maps on file with the Department are sufficient to identify the points of diversion from the source.
- 3. Tax lot 700 in T17S R13E Section 30, NW¼ SW¼, has been split. The authorized place of use is now described as tax lot 701.
- 4. The final proof maps reconfigure the places of use from that authorized by the transfer final order for the following parcels. However, the number of acres of irrigation within the tax lot and legal subdivision did not change. Therefore, the reconfigurations are determined to be satisfactory and are as described below:
 - A. T14S R13E Section 15, SE¼ NW¼, tax lot 3400
 - B. T17S R12E Section 11, NE¼ NW¼, tax lot 600
 - C. T17S R13E Section 18, NW 4 SE 4, tax lot 400
 - D. T17S R13E Section 30, NW1/4 SW1/4, tax lot 701

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW OR RECONSIDERATION

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

4. Satisfactory proof of the changes was submitted with evidence showing that water was used in the location and for the purpose as authorized by the transfer final order.

Conclusions of Law

Pursuant to OAR 690-385-7600, the Department may issue a certificate upon a determination that the application of water to beneficial use under the terms and conditions of the final order approving a permanent district transfer was completed to the extent authorized.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The Department has determined that the application of water to beneficial use under the terms of the final order approving District Permanent Transfer T-9276 was completed to the extent authorized.
- 2. Pursuant to OAR 690-385-7600, the Department shall issue a water right certificate on a determination that it is necessary to produce a certificate describing the right.
