"CERTIFICATE NO. 64123"**PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS**

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION G-10819 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to USDA, Forest Service, Deschutes National Forest, 211 Northeast Revere, Bend, Oregon 97701, phone 382-6922 for use of the waters of one well

for the PURPOSE of potable water supply for Lava Lake Resort

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from September 30, 1982

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.16 cubic foot per second

measured at the point of diversion from the well, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: 2,175 feet North and 90 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 21, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 21, Township 19 South, Range 8 East, WM, in the County of Deschutes.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 19 South, Range 8 East, WM	Section 21	NE 1/4	SE 1/4
	Section 22	NW 1/4	SW 1/4

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before April 15, 1984, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1984.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1985.
