PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION G-11267 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife of PO Box 3503, Portland, Oregon 97208, phone 229-5668, for use of the waters from one well,

for the PURPOSE of anadromous fish rearing

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 25, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 400 gpm

measured at the point of diversion from the well , or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: 806 feet South and 1404 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 18, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 19, Township 3 North, Range 40 East, WM, in the County of Union.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 3 North, Range 40 East, WM Section 19 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 Fish rearing NE 1/4 NW 1/4

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 21, 1985 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 87.
