### PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION G-11380 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Bruce S. and Virginia A. Topham of Star Route 2, Box 894, Sprague River, Oregon, 97639, phone 533-2416, for use of the waters from one well,

for the PURPOSE of irrigation and supplemental irrigation of 469.3 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 24, 1985

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 5.87 cubic feet per second

measured at the point of diversion from the well, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: 140 feet North and 250 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 24, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 24, Township 36 South, Range 11 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The right herein granted shall be subject to prior rights to appropriate ground water from the ground water reservoir which serves as the source of the appropriation authorized herein.

Should it be determined subsequent to the issuance of this permit that the appropriation of ground water herein authorized has a measurable effect on the flow of Whiskey Creek and/or its tributaries, the appropriation of ground water herein authorized shall be regulated in accord with prior rights to appropriate such surface water flows.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 2, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 ~~86~~ Extended to October 1, 1989

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 ~~87~~ Extended to October 1, 1989
