PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION G-11266 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to B.P.O.E. 287 of 351 E. Rose Street, Walla Walla, Washington, 99362, phone 525-2870, for use of the waters from two wells, being 600 gallons per minute from each well, for the PURPOSE of irrigation of 261.9 acres

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from April 23, 1984

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 1200 gallons per minute

measured at the point of diversion from the wells , or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: Well 1 - 20 feet North and 50 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 13, being within the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 13 North, Range 35 East, WM; Well 2 - 230 feet North and 280 feet East from the West 1/4 Corner of Section 19, being within the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 19, * A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

* Township 6 North, Range 35 East, WM, both in the County of Umatilla.

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 7, 1987, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 87.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 88.
