PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION **G-11482** and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to **Continental Brass of 11555 NE Sumner, Portland, Oregon, 97220, phone 257-0196,** for use of the waters from one well,

for the PURPOSE of **factory process water**

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from **February 12, 1986**

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed **130 gallons per minute**

measured at the point of diversion from the **well**, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: **290 feet South and 860 feet East from the North quarter corner of Section 22, being within the NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 22, Township 1 North, Range 2 East, WM, in the County of Multnomah.**

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township 1 North, Range 2 East, WM Section 22 NW 1/4 NE 1/4 Factory process water

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before **July 3, 1987**, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 **88**.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 **89**
