PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION G-11458 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Double M Ranch, Inc., PO Box 38, Adams, Oregon, 97810, phone 566-3840, for use of the waters from two pit wells, being 1.68 cubic feet per second from Pit Well #1 and 3.25 cfs from Pit Well #2,

Irrigation, being use of water from Pit Well #1 for irrigation of 3.8 acres and supplemental irrigation of 147.0 acres and use of water from Pit Well #2 for irrigation of 2.5 acres and supplemental irrigation of 307.5 acres, that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from December 2, 1985, December 2, 1985,

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 4.93 cubic feet per second.

measured at the point of diversion from the wells , or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: Pit Well #1- 700 feet South and 825 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 35; Pit Well #2- 85 feet North and 275 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 35, being within the Pit Well #1- NE 1/4 NE 1/4; Pit Well #2- SW 1/4 SW 1/4 both in Section 35, Township 4 North, Range 28 East, WM, in* A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

The AMOUNT OF WATER used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands shall be limited to 1/80 of one cubic foot per second per acre, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3.0 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year, provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein, provided further that use of water under this permit shall be limited to the appropriation of water only to the extent that such appropriation does not interfere with or deplete the flow of Umatilla River or any tributary thereof; any depletion will require the well to be shut down unless the Order of Withdrawal of the Umatilla River and its tributaries by the Water Resources Commission dated December 2, 1985, is not extended or amended, and shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before May 27, 1988 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1989 .

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 90 .
