is hereby issued a permit to use the waters from ONE HORIZONTAL INFILTRATION SYSTEM, WITHIN COLUMBIA RIVER BASIN, for FISH REARING. The permit to the use of these waters has been issued under Application G-11834, with a date of priority of JULY 15, 1988. The permit is limited to not more than 39.91 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The well is located as follows:

SE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 16, T 5 N, R 26 E, WM;
3094.74 FEET NORTH & 262.44 FEET WEST FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 16.

The permit shall be limited to appropriation of water only to the extent that it does not impair or substantially interfere with prior surface water rights as well as prior ground water rights of others.

The well has been determined to be in hydraulic connection with the Columbia River and, if the need arises, the permit will be regulated to reflect surface water use.

The use of water allowed under this permit shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The place of use is as follows:

	1/4 1/4	SECTION	TOWNSHIP	RANGE, WM
FISH	NE SW	15	5 N	26 E

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 14, 1990, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1990. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1991. *BC extended to 10-1-94*

This permit is for the beneficial use of water. By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan. It is possible that the land use you propose may not be allowed if it is not in keeping with the goals and the acknowledged plan. Your city or county planning agency can advise you about the land-use plan in your area.
