PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

to use the waters of A DUG INFILTRATION GALLERY in the NORTH UMPQUA RIVER BASIN for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 23.7 ACRES.

This Permit is issued approving Application G-11827. The date of priority is JUNE 27, 1988 FOR 0.258 CFS and JANUARY 10, 1990 FOR 0.042 CFS. The use is limited to not more than 0.300 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the gallery.

The infiltration gallery is located as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SECTION 27, T 26 S, R 6 W, W.M.; 2600 FEET SOUTH AND 290 FEET EAST FROM N 1/4 CORNER, SECTION 27.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, shall be limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year. Although declared herein to be for supplemental irrigation, use of water under this permit may be exercised when it is not practical to maintain a pump on North Umpqua River due to high flows of the river. The total quantity diverted from all sources shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4 16.8 ACRES
SE 1/4 NW 1/4 6.6 ACRES
NW 1/4 SE 1/4 0.3 ACRE

SECTION 27

TOWNSHIP 26 SOUTH, RANGE 6 WEST, W.M.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevations in the well at all times. When required by the department, the permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before APRIL 5, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.
