to use the waters of TWO WELLS in the MARKS CREEK BASIN for BOARDING SCHOOL USES (kitchen and sanitary facilities and swimming pool).

This Permit is issued approving Application G-11906. The date of priority is APRIL 6, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 9600.0 GALLONS PER DAY, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The wells are located as follows:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 3, T 13 S, R 19 E, W.M.; WELL 1 - 56.62 FEET SOUTH AND 164.67 FEET EAST; WELL 2 - 772.06 FEET SOUTH AND 352.80 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM NW CORNER, SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 3.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 SE 1/4
SECTION 3
TOWNSHIP 13 SOUTH, RANGE 19 EAST, W.M.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevations in the well at all times. When required by the Department, the permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the Department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MAY 18, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

PAGE TWO

This permit is for beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.
