THIS PERMIT IS HEREBY ISSUED TO

to use the waters of TWO WELLS in the COLUMBIA RIVER BASIN for INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES.

This Permit is issued approving Application G-11952. The date of priority is AUGUST 14, 1989. The use is limited to not more than 1.5 CUBIC FEET PER SECOND or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the wells.

The wells are located as follows:

SE 1/4 NW 1/4, NW 1/4 SW 1/4, SECTION 1, T 6 N, R 2 W, W.M.; WELL 1 - 2740 FEET SOUTH AND 800 FEET EAST; WELL 2 - 3010 FEET SOUTH AND 790 FEET EAST, BOTH FROM NW CORNER, SECTION 1.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under the permit is as follows:

W 1/2 NW 1/4 NW 1/4 SW 1/4 SECTION 1

N 1/2 NE 1/4 SECTION 2 TOWNSHIP 6 NORTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

SW 1/4 SW 1/4
SECTION 36
TOWNSHIP 7 NORTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. When required by the department, the permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before MAY 18, 1991, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992. Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 1993.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder will submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use granted herein may be made only at times when sufficient water is available to satisfy all prior rights.
