to use the waters of TWO WELLS in the DESCHUTES RIVER BASIN for QUASI-MUNICIPAL USE.

This permit is issued approving Application G-12370. The date of priority is DECEMBER 28, 1990. The use is limited to not more than 0.83 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND (CFS), BEING 0.44 CFS FROM FROM WELL 1 AND 0.39 CFS FROM WELL 2, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The wells are located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, NW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 31, T 14 S, R 13 E, W.M.; WELL 1 - 2600 FEET NORTH AND 1250 FEET WEST, WELL 2 - 1790 FEET NORTH AND 1670 FEET WEST, BOTH FROM SE CORNER, SECTION 31.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the proposed place of use under this permit is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4 NE 1/4 SE 1/4 NW 1/4 SE 1/4 SECTION 31

TOWNSHIP 14 SOUTH, RANGE 13 EAST, W.M.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. When required by the department, the permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 8, 1992, and shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993. Complete application of the water shall be made on or before October 1, 1994.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.
