The specific limits and conditions of the use are listed below.

APPLICATION FILE NUMBER: G-14427

SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL, IN THE WILLAMETTE RIVER BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: IRRIGATION OF 10.0 ACRES

MAXIMUM RATE: 25.0 ACRE-FEET PER YEAR, MITIGATED BY STORED WATER FROM THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION

PERIOD OF USE: MARCH 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 OR AS FURTHER LIMITED BY CONTRACT WITH BUREAU OF RECLAMATION

DATE OF PRIORITY: DECEMBER 23, 1996

POINT OF DIVERSION LOCATION: NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 22, T3S, R1E, W.M.; SOUTH 32 DEGREES 9 MINUTES 10 SECONDS EAST 2650.33 FEET FROM THE ANGLE CORNER ON THE NE LINE OF BROCK DLC 46

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2 1/2 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

THE PLACE OF USE IS LOCATED AS FOLLOWS:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 5.1 ACRES  
NW 1/4 SE 1/4 4.9 ACRES  
SECTION 22  
TOWNSHIP 3 SOUTH, RANGE 1 EAST, W.M.

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or

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measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

Groundwater shall be produced only from the alluvial groundwater reservoir between approximately 30 feet and 100 feet below land surface.

This permit may be exercised only in conjunction with legal access to Bureau of Reclamation stored contract water.

The use of water under this right is subject to the terms and conditions of contract No. 7-07-10-W1144, or a satisfactory replacement, between the Bureau of Reclamation and the applicant, a copy of which is on file in the records of the Water Resources Department.

If the riparian area is disturbed in the process of developing a point of diversion, the permittee shall be responsible for restoration and enhancement of such riparian area.

The use may be restricted if the quality of the source stream or downstream water decrease to the point that those waters no longer meet state or federal water quality standards due to reduced flows.

#### STANDARD CONDITIONS

The wells shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.

The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Actual construction of the well shall begin within one year from permit issuance. Complete application of water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2002.
