SOURCE OF WATER: A WELL IN FROG LAKE BASIN

PURPOSE OR USE: COMMERCIAL USE AND IRRIGATION OF 7.0 ACRES

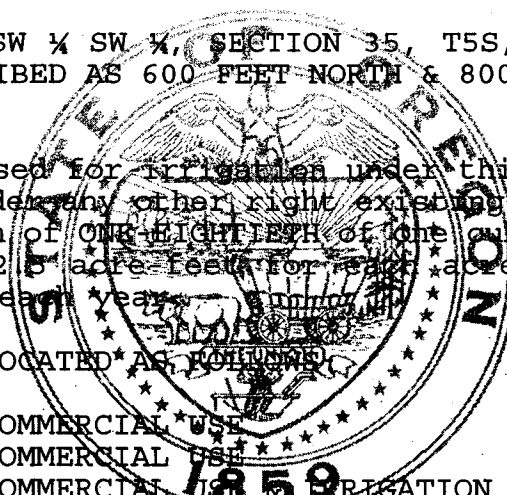
MAXIMUM RATE: 0.276 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, BEING 0.276 CFS FOR COMMERCIAL USE AND NO MORE THAN 0.088 CFS FOR IRRIGATION OF 7.0 ACRES

PERIOD OF USE: YEAR ROUND FOR COMMERCIAL USE AND JULY 1 THROUGH OCTOBER 31 FOR IRRIGATION

DATE OF PRIORITY: NOVEMBER 26, 2001

WELL SITE LOCATION: SW ¼ SW ¼, SECTION 35, T5S, R6E, W.M.; WITHIN 50 FEET OF A POINT DESCRIBED AS 600 FEET NORTH & 800 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER OF SECTION 35

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2 ½ acre feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

- SW ¼ NE ¼ COMMERCIAL USE
- SE ¼ NW ¼ COMMERCIAL USE
- NE ¼ SW ¼ COMMERCIAL IRRIGATION OF 2.0 ACRES

- NW ¼ SE ¼ COMMERCIAL USE & IRRIGATION OF 2.0 ACRES
- SW ¼ SE ¼ COMMERCIAL USE

Measurement, recording and reporting conditions:

- A. Before water use may begin under this permit, the permittee shall install a meter or other suitable measuring device as approved by the Director. The permittee shall maintain the meter or measuring device in good working order.
- B. The permittee shall allow the watermaster access to the meter or measuring device; provided however, where the meter or measuring device is located within a private structure, the watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- C. The Director may require the permittee to keep and maintain a record of the amount (volume) of water used and may require the permittee to report water use on a periodic schedule as established by the Director. In addition, the Director may require the permittee to report general water use information, the periods of water use and the place and nature of use of water under the permit. The Director may provide an opportunity for the permittee to submit alternative reporting procedures for review and approval.

Use of water under authority of this permit may be regulated if analysis of data available after the permit is issued discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of the right or as those quantities may be subsequently reduced.

If the number, location, or construction of any well deviates from that proposed in the permit application or permit conditions, the conclusions of the Proposed Final Order and Final Order under which this permit was granted may be revised, conditions may be appropriately revised, or this permit may not be valid.

**STANDARD CONDITIONS**

If substantial interference with a senior water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from any well listed on this permit, then use of water from the well(s) shall be discontinued or reduced and/or the schedule of withdrawal shall be regulated until or unless the Department approves or implements an alternative administrative action to mitigate the interference. The Department encourages junior and senior appropriators to jointly develop plans to mitigate interferences.

The wells shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works shall be equipped with a usable access port, and may also include an air line and pressure gauge adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The use shall conform to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

Prior to receiving a certificate of water right, the permit holder shall submit the results of a pump test meeting the department's standards, to the Water Resources Department. The Director may require water level or pump test results every ten years thereafter.

Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this permit may result in action including, but not limited to, restrictions on the use, civil penalties, or cancellation of the permit.

This permit is for the beneficial use of water without waste. The water user is advised that new regulations may require the use of best practical technologies or conservation practices to achieve this end.

By law, the land use associated with this water use must be in compliance with statewide land-use goals and any local acknowledged land-use plan.


The use of water shall be limited when it interferes with any prior surface or ground water rights.

The Director finds that the proposed use(s) of water described by this permit, as conditioned, will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest.

Complete application of the water to the use shall be made on or before October 1, 2006. If the water is not completely applied before this date, and the permittee wishes to continue development under the permit, the permittee must submit an application for extension of time, which may be approved based upon the merits of the application.

Within one year after complete application of water to the proposed use, the permittee shall submit a claim of beneficial use, which includes a map and report, prepared by a Certified Water Rights Examiner (CWRE).
