APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT

To appropriate the Ground Waters of the State of Oregon

I, Harlan L. & Ada P. Ross (Name of applicant) of Rt. 1, Box 190, Harrisburg (Postoffice Address), county of Linn, state of Oregon, do hereby make application for a permit to appropriate the following described ground waters of the state of Oregon, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS:

If the applicant is a corporation, give date and place of incorporation

1. Give name of nearest stream to which the well, tunnel or other source of water development is situated Willamette River (Name of stream)

2. The amount of water which the applicant intends to apply to beneficial use is 0.5875 cubic feet per second or gallons per minute.

3. The use to which the water is to be applied is Irrigation

S. 25° 25' E. 955 ft.

4. The well or other source is located ft. and ft. from the corner of Chas. B. Cochran DLC 52 in T. 16 S., R. 4 W. (Section or subdivision)

5. The main pipeline to be 2400' miles in length, terminating in the NE 1/4 of NE 1/4 of Sec. 2, Twp. 16 S., R. 4 W., W. M., the proposed location being shown throughout on the accompanying map.

6. The name of the well or other works is Ross No. 2

DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

7. If the flow to be utilized is artesian, the works to be used for the control and conservation of the supply when not in use must be described.

8. The development will consist of one well having a diameter of 10 inches and an estimated depth of 20 feet. It is estimated that feet of the well will require steel casing. Depth to water table is estimated 7 feet.

If the location of the well, tunnel, or other development work is less than one-fourth mile from a natural stream or stream channel, give the distance to the nearest point on each of such channels and the difference in elevation between the stream bed and the ground surface at the source of development unnamed slough is approximately 1150 feet from well. Difference in elevation is approximately 10 feet.

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.29 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the well or source of appropriation, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from Ross Well #2

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be cased as necessary in accordance with good practice and if the flow is artesian the works shall include proper capping and control valve to prevent the waste of ground water.

The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The priority date of this permit is May 15, 1963

Actual construction work shall begin on or before July 18, 1964 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1964

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1965
