**Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon**

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed ..... 300 gallons ..... per minute ~~out of the diversion~~ measured at the point of diversion from the well or source of appropriation, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from a well .....

The use to which this water is to be applied is ..... supplemental irrigation .....

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to ..... 1/80th ..... of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed .....  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ..... acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year; provided further that the right allowed herein shall be limited to any deficiency in the available supply of any prior right existing for the same land and shall not exceed the limitation allowed herein .....

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

The priority date of this permit is ..... November 5, 1979 .....

Actual construction work shall begin on or before ..... July 14, 1981 .....

and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1981 .....

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1982 .....
