make application for a permit to appropriate the following described ground waters of the State of Oregon:

1. The development will consist of SUMP (Give number of wells, tile lines, infiltration galleries, etc.)

having a diameter of 150' X 150' and an estimated depth of 8' feet.

2. The well or other source is to be located 1165 ft. SOUTH and 20 ft. EAST (N. or S.) (E. or W.)

from the NORTHWEST corner of SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 39S, RANGE 3W (Public Land Survey Corner)

Length of Irrigation Pipe: Sufficient amount to cover 5 acres with use of "Flex Irrigation system, with some acerage being developed under flood irrigation. Pipe will be 2" PVC , with using a 2 1/2 HP Gould pump @ 40lbs. pressure. Land has slight decline so the flood irrigation in parts of the 5 acres will more than do the job of irrigation.

On the "Flex Irrigation System" PVC pipe will be laid underground, with takeoff risers ever 100', with coverage by the use of rainbird sprinkler heads.

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Permit to Appropriate the Public Waters of the State of Oregon

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application and do hereby grant the same, SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS INCLUDING THE EXISTING MINIMUM FLOW POLICIES ESTABLISHED BY THE WATER POLICY REVIEW BOARD and the following limitations and conditions:

The right herein granted is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.06 cubic feet per second measured at the point of diversion from the well or source of appropriation, or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users, from a sump

The use to which this water is to be applied is irrigation

If for irrigation, this appropriation shall be limited to 1/80th of one cubic foot per second or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2 1/2 acre feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year;

and shall be subject to such reasonable rotation system as may be ordered by the proper state officer.

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times.

The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.


The priority date of this permit is August 1, 1980

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 5, 1982 and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1982

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 1983

Extended to Oct 1, 1984
