PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION G-10836 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued to Lloyd Duyck of Route 4, Box 338, Cornelius, Oregon 97113, for the use of the waters of a well

for the PURPOSE of food processing

that the PRIORITY OF THE RIGHT dates from November 17, 1982

and is limited to the amount of water which can be applied to beneficial use and shall not exceed 0.29 cubic foot per second

measured at the point of diversion from the well , or its equivalent in case of rotation with other water users.

The well is to be LOCATED: III.0 feet South and 1,401.0 feet West from the Northeast Corner of the Wm. Geiger DLC 47 in Section 4, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 4, Township I South, Range 3 West, WM, in the County of Washington.

A description of the PLACE OF USE under the permit, and to which such right is appurtenant, is as follows:

Township I South, Range 3 West, WM Section 4 SE 1/4 SW 1/4 water for washing and preparation of food for processing

The well shall be constructed in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon. The works constructed shall include an air line and pressure gauge or an access port for measuring line, adequate to determine water level elevation in the well at all times. The permittee shall install and maintain a weir, meter, or other suitable measuring device, and shall keep a complete record of the amount of ground water withdrawn.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before January 5, 1984 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 85.

Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before October 1, 19 $\,$ 86 $\,$.
