PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-62699 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States, Ochoco National Forest of PSR Box 6015, Paulina, Oregon 97751, for the construction of Sedge II Reservoir, and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Sunflower Creek, for stock and wildlife and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the Water Resources * The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township 16 South, Range 26 East, WM, in the County of Grant.

6.25 The maximum height will be feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will , slope of upstream face 1:1 , slope of downstream face1:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 2.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.23 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 3.5 feet

Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimension of the spillway are: Around the dam, the bottom width of the spillway will be 6.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 25.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and crest of the spillway will be 2.3 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in the channel.

The dams will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.46 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 11, 1981

Actual construction work shall begin on or before October 22, 1985 , and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986 .
