**PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE  
for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS**

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-67896 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Iola B. Hickok of 105 Harris Street, The Dalles, Oregon 97058, phone 296-2647, for the construction of a reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Hood River, to be appropriated under Application 67698, Permit 48954 for recreation.

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 21, Township 2 North, Range 10 East, WM, in the County of Wasco.

The maximum height will be 4.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 6.0 feet, slope of upstream face 2:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.0 foot

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.40 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 5.0 feet

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: Around the dam, the bottom width of the spillway will be 1.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 1.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 1.0 foot.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: Free flow and overflow from the East end.

The structure is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 1.5 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is October 14, 1983 .

Actual construction work shall begin on or before November 21, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986 .
