## PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-64823 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 883-6714, for the construction of Desolation Pond Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Buck Lake for livestock, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the Water \* The dam will be LOCATED in the: NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 1, Township 38 South, Range 5 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a, slope of upstream face n/a, slope of downstream face n/a, and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.7 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 2.0 feet

\* Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in the channel.

The pond was formed by removing the material below land surface.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.56 acre-foot

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 7, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.
