PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68112 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Leslie McFarland and Georgiana McFarland of PO Box 815, Sutherlin, Oregon 97479, phone 459-3859, for the construction of an unnamed reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Birch Creek, to be appropriated under Application 68113, Permit 48992 for irrigation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 24, Township 25 South, Range 5 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a, slope of upstream face n/a, slope of downstream face n/a, and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.25 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 10.0 feet

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in the channel.

The dam will be an excavated pond.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 2.0 acre-feet

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is July 2, 1984

Actual construction work shall begin on or before December 21, 1985, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.
