PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-64247 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States - Wallowa Whitman National Forest of PO Box 38, Unity, Oregon 97884, phone 446-3351, for the construction of Skinny Dip Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Bear Gulch for livestock and wildlife, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined* The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 12, Township 10 South, Range 35 East, WM, in the County of Baker.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a, slope of upstream face n/a, slope of downstream face n/a, and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 1.5 acres and the maximum depth of water will be 9.0 feet

* by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 13.0 acre-feet
