PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-67064 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Bureau of Land Management of PO Box 700, Vale, Oregon 97918, phone 473-3144, for the construction of Willow Creek Waterhole Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed intermittent stream, a tributary of Willow Creek for livestock and wildlife, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when *

The dam will be LOCATED in the: SW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 18, Township 17 South, Range 44 East, WM, in the County of Malheur.

The maximum height will be n/a feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be n/a, slope of upstream face n/a, slope of downstream face n/a, and height of dam above water line when full n/a

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.5 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 4.0 feet

* determined by the Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: None.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The structure is in the channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.7 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 30, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 22, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.
