### PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-68193 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to Elmer R. Sutton of Route 2, Box 2, Days Creek, Oregon 97429, phone 825-3482, for the construction of five unnamed reservoirs and storage of water from Porter Creek, a tributary of Day Creek, to be appropriated under Application 68125, Permit 49184 for irrigation,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 10, Township 30 South, Range 4 West, WM, in the County of Douglas.

The maximum height will be 10.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 12.0 feet, slope of upstream face 3:1, slope of downstream face 2:1, and height of dam above water line when full 3.0 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.6 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 9.0 feet

The locations and dimensions of the spillways are: Around dams. The bottom width of the spillway will be 10.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 15.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 3.0 feet.

The locations and dimensions of the outlet conduits will be: Through dams. Reservoir 1 - 12 inches; Reservoir 2, 3, 4, 5 - 8 inches.

The structures are in the channel.

The dams will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 2.0 acre-feet, being 0.5 af in Res. 1; 0.4 af in Res. 2; 0.4 af in Res. 3; 0.4 af in Res. 4; 0.3 af in Res. 5

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is October 4, 1984.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before February 27, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.
