PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-66672 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 883-6714, for the construction of Skellock Creek Reservoir and storage of water from Skellock Creek, a tributary of Williamson River for livestock use, and is subject to the installation and maintenance of an outlet pipe, or to provide other means to evacuate the stored water when determined by the*
The dam will be LOCATED in the: SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 9, Township 31 South, Range 10 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

The maximum height will be 3.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 6.0 , slope of downstream face 4:1 , and height of dam above water line when full 2.5 feet

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.045 acre , and the maximum depth of water will be 3.0 feet

* Water Resources Director to be necessary to satisfy prior downstream rights.

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: The bottom width of the spillway will be 5.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 7.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 2.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The dam is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.05 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 22, 1983.

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 11, 1986 diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 19 86.
