PERMIT to CONSTRUCT a RESERVOIR and to STORE for BENEFICIAL USE the PUBLIC WATERS

This is to certify that I have examined APPLICATION R-66681 and do hereby grant the same SUBJECT TO EXISTING RIGHTS AND THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS:

This permit is issued to United States, Winema National Forest of PO Box 1390, Klamath Falls, Oregon 97601, phone 883-6714, for the construction of Weyerhaeuser Reservoir and storage of water from an unnamed stream, a tributary of Klamath Marsh for livestock and road watering (road maintenance, construction and dust abatement) to be appropriated under Application 66696, Permit 49223,

The dam will be LOCATED in the: NW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 5, Township 29 South, Range 9 East, WM, in the County of Klamath.

The maximum height will be 4.0 feet above the stream bed or ground surface at the centerline. The top width will be 8.0, slope of upstream face 4:1, slope of downstream face 4:1, and height of dam above water line when full 2.0 feet.

The area submerged by the reservoir, when full, will be 0.062 acre, and the maximum depth of water will be 4.0 feet

The location and dimensions of the spillway are: The bottom width of the spillway will be 4.0 feet. The top width of the spillway will be 6.0 feet. The distance between the crest of the dam and the crest of the spillway will be 2.0 feet.

The location and dimension of the outlet conduit will be: None.

The dam is in channel.

The dam will be earthfill construction.

The right hereunder shall be limited to the storage of 0.1 acre-foot

The PRIORITY DATE of this permit is September 22, 1983

Actual construction work shall begin on or before March 11, 1986, and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and be completed on or before October 1, 1986.
